SPEAKER LAST WEEK

PROSTATE CANCER : Speaker **Tony Morrissey** left nothing unsaid as he represented the Prostate Cancer Foundation Australia. As a survivor of prostate cancer himself, Tony volunteers his time in spreading greater awareness of the illness. For Tony, greater awareness equals saving men's lives, and with PC now being the most diagnosed cancer in Australia, there has never been a more important time to act.

3 years ago, Tony went to his GG with a few complaints and in no time, he was diagnosed with PC. Then followed visits to specialists, specimens were taken and multiple visits to hospitals as Maroonda, Box Hill and SSSSSS. Tony has Stage 4, Class 5 PC. Stage 5 locates the PC in his pelvis, neck and shoulders.

PC needs various approaches and eventual care from a Management Nurse. In Australia, the mortality rate is at 70 a day. He claims that Monash University rates as the best research centre in the world. Of great assistance has been the recently developed drug Xtandi that contains enzalutamide.



Since 1984, PC in Australia has grown 571%. It is the most common cancer in the nation. Tony used the term "terrified" on numerous occasions. He observed that men do not discuss the issue. He stressed the importance of targeted physical exercise which can slow the progression of PC.

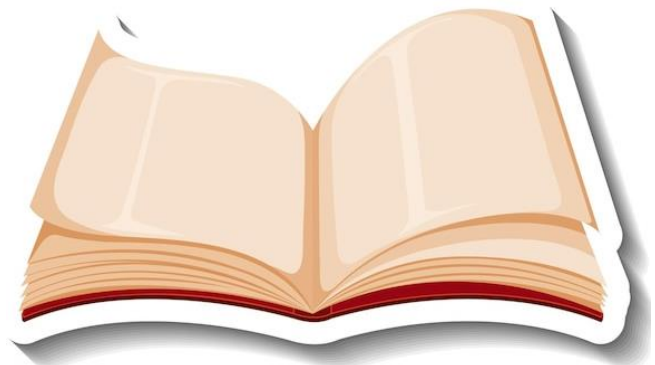
